Meeting Report

This week's meeting was a rather special and extended affair, featuring the annual District Governor's visit, accompanied by his wife and also Assistant DG Don Will. It was a partner's night and we had around 85 members, partner's and guests in attendance. Perhaps the most notable guests (apart from DG Sam) were Kevin Parken's wife Wendy and her carers. It was good to see her "out and about".

Past President Damian gave us a brief Rotary Information presentation regarding the status of the Polio Eradication programme. In summary, numbers of reported cases this year are well down on 2015 (27 compared to 51 same time last year). The major problems affecting the programme are the very dangerous operating conditions in Pakistan and Afghanistan where something like 80 people involved in the programme have lost their lives since 2012. It is also of concern that there have been some cases reported in Nigeria.

The enormous financial support and commitment of the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation was acknowledged.

We had a remarkable Sergeant's session. He arrived very casually dressed, having spent the day and previous evening looking after grandchildren and striking every obstacle imaginable in the course of delivering them home to Henley Beach and then getting back to the meeting. It was reminiscent of the "5P" rule of my business days. However, there was certainly a well planned extraction of hefty fines from all members and visitors, \$103 in total. His new "donger" or persuader may have assisted in this task!

Mal and Val Hansen took the opportunity to summarise the recently completed CROE trip in which there were 31 participants. Following an outline of the day by day activities, Charlie Paterson (GM Marketing & PR for RFDS) made a brief presentation about the Flying Doctor's presence and operations in this state, with a focus on the newly opened operations base at Adelaide Airport and their new Pilatus PC24 jet that cost around \$10 million.

In conclusion, cheques totalling \$30,000 were presented to Charlie to be used to assist funding of the new jet aircraft that is considered a "gamechanger" in terms of the operational capabilities.

District Governor Sam Camporeale was introduced by President Bryan and gave us an informative and

entertaining outline of his year to date and some of the key observations he has made. It was interesting that he has visited 34 clubs in the district to date and a significant concern was that some clubs seem to have lost sight of the fact that Rotary is primarily a service organization.

Apart from outlining the many organisations within Rotary, Sam spent considerable time emphasizing the significance of the Rotary Foundation, which celebrates its 100th anniversary next year. In fact, Atlanta was chosen as the location of the 2017 world convention in recognition of it being the "birthplace" of the Rotary Foundation. It is expected that there will be around 25 district members attending the convention next year.

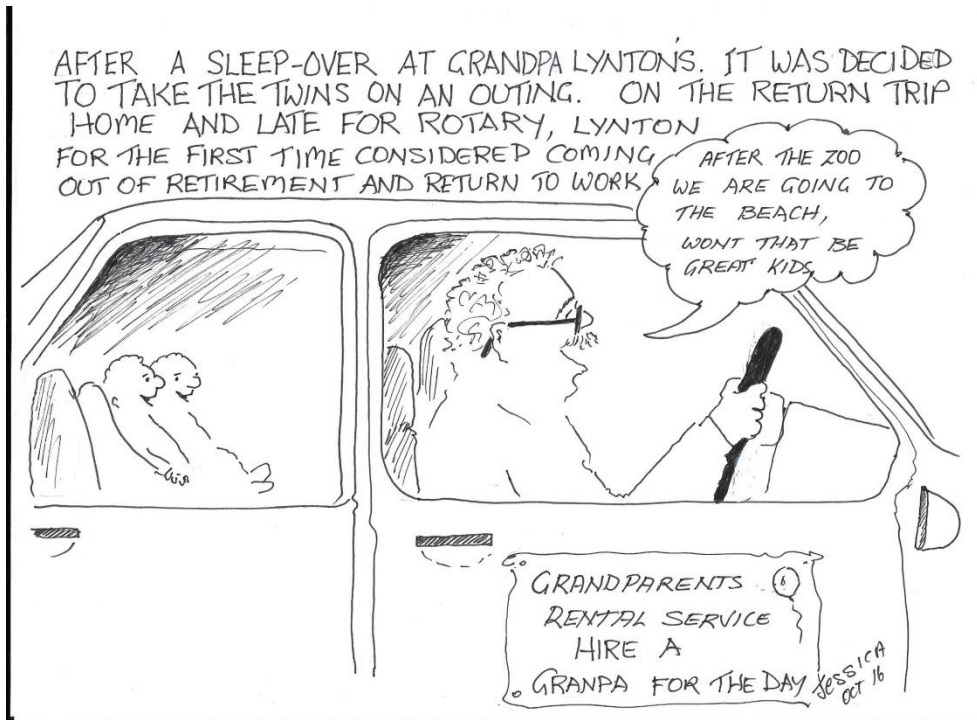
